



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
#### NO SUCH THING AS A NATURAL DISASTER

- "Disaster" is an analytical construct that unfolds over time not an isolated event
- Viewing hurricanes in this way emphasizes the underlying structural conditions
- Critical disaster studies




## CHANGE IN PUERTO RICAN Sovereignty

- U.S. acquires Puerto Rico from Spain in the Treaty of Paris 1898
- U.S.Army invades and occupies 1898-1900



## **HURRICANE SAN CIRIACO 1899**


- 3,400 Deaths
- \$20 million property damage
- Entire coffee crop destroyed






# **U.S. ARMY RELIEF EFFORTS**

- Brigadier General George Davis had no standing orders on how to handle hurricane relief
- Organized relief operations from the top down
- Partnered with local elites
- Only those who buried the dead would be fed



## POLITICAL, ECONOMIC, AND SOCIAL PRECEDENTS ESTABLISHED

- Unilaterally changed Puerto Rico's economy
- Hallmarks of American disaster relief
- Foraker Act 1900




# MUÑOZ MARÍN, MOSCOSO, TRUMAN, EISENHOWER AND SOVEREIGNTY

- Rise of the PPD and initial Success of Operation Bootstrap
- Creation of Estado Libre
   Asociado 1952
- Truman and Eisenhower believed Puerto Rico could be independent



## HURRICANE SANTA CLARA 1956

- Federal Disaster Relief Act 1950
- 16 deaths
- \$40 million in property damage
- Muñoz Marín wants Puerto Rico to handle disaster relief without U.S. aid
- Eisenhower overrules him and declares disaster



## FEMA AND NEW APPROACHES TO DISASTER RELIEF

- FEMA passed in 1979
- Process for acquiring aid more complicated
- Increasing effects of climate change stretching FEMA thin
- Between 1980 and 2020 the costs associated with climate-related disasters in the U.S. and its territories exceeded \$1.79 trillion








#### **Puerto Rico debt woes**

#### FACTS, FIGURES, AND UNDERLYING CONDITIONS

- Between 2000-2020, II.8 percent of the population migrated off the island
- When Hurricane Maria hit in 2017, Puerto Rico had over \$74 million in bonded debt
- Unemployment was twice the national average at 10.8 percent
- Puerto Rico imported over 90 percent of its food products from the United States
- Infrastructure neglected and power grid antiquated
